Dear colleague and friend,

The Roma Women's Association 'For Our Children' from Timisoara and Foundation Desire from Cluj, Romania, launches the first call for the second issue of the journal **Nevi Sara Kali. Roma Women's Journal. Revista Femeilor Rome. Romane Žuvleanqe Žurnalo**. This publication was initiated within the project Equality through difference. Roma women's access to the labor market ([www.femrom.ro](http://www.femrom.ro)) financed by „Invest in People” European Social Fund, Operational Program for the Development of Human Resources 2007-2013. Its first issue was kindly supported by the „Romani Women's Empowerment Grants” Initiative of the Roma Participation Program/Open Society Institute.

Our journal addresses the complex and complicated issue of “Roma women” at the intersection of their geopolitical position, ethnicity, social and economic status and age with the aim to represent the socio-cultural diversity of Roma women, seen in their immediate communities, and in the context of their relationship with both Roma men and non-Roma women. Crucial for us is the understanding of how they are subjected to multiple and intersectional discrimination, but also how they are acting as powerful agencies by fighting for the enhancement of the society within which they live, and for improving their own life conditions but as well as of other subordinated and disadvantaged social categories.

We continue publishing in our journal papers of different genres, produced by Roma and non-Roma women and men: scientific analysis of approximately 10-12 pages; essays of 3-5 pages; interviews and other types of creative writing that give voice to Roma women of different social strata; shorter articles presenting different associations and organizations involving Roma women from Europe and projects related to our subject; book reviews; brief announcements regarding upcoming events (conferences, festivals, seminars etc.); information on future plans, search for partnerships, publications or on other concerns. This diversity of genres is meant to enable networking among activists and academics committed to our joint cause across borders.

The first issue of Nevi Sara Kali published articles in English and articles in Romanian, providing English, Romanian and Romani paper abstracts and authors' presentations. In order to make the journal more accessible for an international public, while keeping its accessibility for its readers from Romania, besides its English papers, the second issue will publish the articles written in Romanian both in its original language and English translation. Translations are going to be assured by our team.

We are expecting your precious contribution starting with February 2010, till the middle of May 2010 at the latest. The journal is expected to be published in July 2010. We would appreciate if you could let us know about your plans of publishing in the second issue of the journal till the end of February.
